BIG SHANTY FESTIVAL HISTORY

In 1975, merchants in the downtown area of Kennesaw created a business organization that would promote and preserve the historical heritage of the downtown area of Kennesaw and encourage people to patronize their businesses. Thus the Kennesaw Business Association was chartered. The General at the Big Shanty Museum (original name) was the focal point of the City's heritage.

Town Center wasn't even a gleam in anyone's eye then — the area was still being farmed. I-75 stopped in Marietta and resumed in Cartersville, and Highway 41 (now Cobb Parkway) was dotted with Stuckey's, quilts, and boiled peanuts.

The idea started with Gayle DeSpain, Lynda Spence, Carol Thompson and Jean Guess, all local business women and members of the KBA. In discussing ways to bring new people and business into Kennesaw, they planned a spring outdoor sale in an open area between their shops on Main Street, with the hopes of attracting customers with a colorful display of antiques and craft items.

Dr. Frank Boone, President in 1975, suggested that their plans be sponsored on a larger scale by the business association and supported by the City of Kennesaw (he was a Councilman too). Thus the first Festival was born. Originally known as Trade Days, that first Spring, 36 booth spaces were set up. In 1977, Festival Chairman, the late Dent Myers, added a civil war battle reenactment and over 10,000 people attended the Spring event.

The rest is history, with the sponsorship of the KBA and the active support of the City of Kennesaw, the Festival has spread from the front lawn of By-Gone Treasures to encompass the lawn of the Museum, the Depot Parking lot, line the streets of J. O. Stephenson Ave and Main St.. and fill the parking areas at City Hall. Over 250 booths have been sold for this year's festival — I don't think any of us who were involved in the planning of the first event ever envisioned how large and successful it would grow..

For forty-eight years the Kennesaw Business Association and the City of Kennesaw have worked together to make this Festival a success and fun for everyone. ANDREW BRAMLETT'S LOCAL HISTORY STORIES

Last month, I wrote about the 1930s efforts to return the locomotive General to Kennesaw. At the time, it was on display at Chattanooga's Union Station. Efforts began again in 1959 to bring the historic engine back to Georgia. In that year, the idea was floated that



the train be moved to Stone Mountain, prompting Kennesaw residents to push for its return to our area. The Governor even promised to order its return on the condition that Kennesaw build a museum. City leaders planned to utilize Monument Park, at the corner of Main and Cherokee Streets, for the new building. However, the Louisville & Nashville Railroad was still resistant. Later that year, the state attorney general sided with the railroad.

In preparation for the Civil War Centennial, the railroad restored the General to operating condition and sent it on a tour across the country. In April 1962, it returned to Kennesaw to much fanfare. The entire downtown was decorated to look like a Civil War community, and the local citizens made period clothing. The return was only temporary, and the General soon left town under its own steam. After the end of its tour, it made its way back to Chattanooga.

In the late 1960s, a legal battle began again. The railroad agreed to return the engine to Kennesaw in 1968, but the City of Chattanooga sued for custody. As the train made its way south, it was stopped by Chattanooga sheriffs. After a year of court battles, which eventually reached the US Supreme Court, the railroad was granted rights to the engine. In April 1972, the General returned to Kennesaw again, this time permanently. A museum, first called the Big Shanty Museum, was created inside of the old Frey Cotton Gin. The museum has been renovated and expanded many times and is now the Southern Museum of Civil War and Locomotive History and is affiliated with the Smithsonian Institutions.







JUST THE FACTS: A TAX BY ANY OTHER NAME RANDY SCAMIRHORN,

COBB COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD CHAIR

Dear parents and taxpayers of Cobb County, during today's time together, "Just the Facts" sheds light on an issue that impacts every property owner, and apparently school, in the county.

Before we dive in, a word to those who regularly attack one of the best school systems in the country and tell this grandfather to "stay in my lane," if anything takes one dollar from your children's education, it is my lane.

It's no secret that some of the Cobb County Board of Commissioners recently proposed

a stormwater "fee," which is a creative way to describe what amounts to a rainfall tax.

To recap recent events, the majority of the Commissioners' latest "fee" proposal would charge property owners every month based on the amount of paved surface area on their property. Your driveways and your child's school have a lot of paved property, as I recall.

In the past, all property owners paid a stormwater fee based on the amount of water they consumed. The Commissioners who proposed this "fee" now say they need to add a "fee" since water usage is not connected to stormwater impact. If you're not following the logic, you're not the only one trying to comprehend this tomfoolery.

The concept of taxpayers and schools paying a "fee" based on the amount of rain that falls on their property is "interesting," to say the least. Well, that's a polite phrase for it, anyway. Moms, dads, business owners, and principals can't control the weather, but we're being asked to foot the bill for nature's whims. This rainfall "fee," if passed, will add to the monthly bills of hardworking parents and, again, apparently, schools across our county.

For our families who already live on a tight budget, this additional "fee" on their already

strained finances is grossly unfair. I've raised the impact this fee would have on our schools a number of times with district leaders. Unfortunately, our staff does not have enough information from the Commissioners to know how much money would be taken from classrooms, but they know it would mean fewer dollars for teachers and students. We also know our schools could have been made legally exempt, but they weren't.

After consulting with our legal team, we believe this bizarre 'stormwater fee' will be imposed upon schools, as well as the thousands of acres on which your schools are built.

The reality is that every school dollar taken for stormwater management is a dollar taken away from our children's futures. As your Cobb Schools Board Chair, I stand in staunch opposition to additional "fees" on our schools and on the taxpayer. Our students and teachers deserve better than to have their learning compromised by yet another threat to dollars that belong in the classroom. I know I speak for the majority of the Board when I point out that the latest proposal being brought forward by Cobb Commission Chair Lisa Cupid is fraught with problems for our schools and our parents.

I'm not telling you how to vote; I'm telling you what is and isn't good for our schools and Cobb's children.

As Cobb County has always fought for a better life for the next generation, I urge every resident of Cobb County to join me in supporting children, education, and wise use of your dollars, even when a tax is called a "fee." To those who will support this ill-conceived "fee" on our schools and the entire county, it is worth repeating: protecting our children's future is my, and the majority of the Board's, lane.
