2019 ACWORTH CITIZEN OF THE YEAR: NCHS'S COACH SHANE QUEEN

Shane Queen, Head Football Coach at North Cobb High School, has been named the 2019 Acworth Citizen of the Year for his leadership at his school and within the community. As Head Coach for 14 years, Queen has led his team to regional wins and was named the Cobb County Coach of the Year in both 2007 and 2013.

Queen is not only a coach, but also serves as a positive role model in the lives of the students in the Acworth Community. He goes the extra mile with his players, investing in both their academic and athletic lives. He often addresses his "5 P's" that he wants each student to think about as they navigate through their years at North Cobb High School: Purpose, Passion, Perseverance, Pride, and People.

Queen has tirelessly worked with community members and partners to improve school facilities so that all North Cobb students, who many times come from families who simply can't afford facility upgrade support, can be trained with the best equipment possible.

Queen recently took students on a trip to serve with the Power of Peace Program in Selma, Alabama. They helped feed more than 200 people who are food-insecure during the visit. Coach Queen is always focused on how he can grow young men into future husbands, fathers, and contributing members of the Acworth community.

2019 KENNESAW CITIZEN OF THE YEAR: KENNESAW POLICE CHIEF BILL WESTENBERGER

Bill Westenberg, Police Chief with the City of Kennesaw, has been named the 2019 Kennesaw Citizen of the Year for his commitment to being involved with and available for the community. He has a true passion for his community, which is shown through his constant support, actions and participation.

In his community, Chief Westenberg is actively involved in two programs with missions to affect proactive and positive change in Kennesaw: "Chief's Youth Advisory Board," where Kennesaw 8th through 12th grade students get a chance to voice their concerns about current issues in their lives; and "Accelerated Community Engagement," which was designed to help middle school students with their unique issues in both Acworth and Kennesaw.

Chief Westenberg also chairs a group called "First Watch," a faith-based forum for adults in the community that promotes the growth of goodness and leadership in children and adults. He's also involved with "Through Our Hearts," a group of community leaders in Kennesaw that meets the first Tuesday morning of each month to focus on helping people in need.

ANDREW BRAMLETT'S WHY WE SAY WHAT WE SAY.

Our story begins
this month in 4th
century Turkey with
a man named SAINT
NICHOLAS. He did
many good deeds
during his life,
including helping
the sick and giving
all of his wealth to
the poor people of
the area. The most famous tale associated
with him involves a poor man who could
not afford a dowry for his daughters. One
night, Saint Nicholas heard about this man
and dropped a bag filled with money down
his chimney, and it landed in some stockings
hanging by the fire.



Saint Nicholas became a popular figure
and would go on to become the patron
saint of children and of sailors. Because of
his generosity and being the patron saint
of children, he quickly became a part of
Christmas. Parents would give gifts on
Christmas to their kids pretending it was
“Saint Nick”. After the protestant reformation,
saints began to go out of style, so his name in
England became “FATHER CHRISTMAS”.
In Austria and Germany, he became known as
the “Christkind”. This later became KRIS
KRINGLE. Over time, the stories of the
many good deeds he did while he was alive
were told less and less, to the point they were
forgotten.

In the Catholic Denmark, however, the
story of Saint Nick stayed popular. The Dutch
name for Saint Nicholas was Sinter Klaas.
The Dutch brought that name to America by
way of New Amsterdam, now New York. The
stories of Sinter Klaas and his good deeds,
long forgotten to the mostly protestant settlers,
grew popular. As the tradition grew beyond
the Dutch, his name was “Americanized” to
SANTA CLAUS.

The modern image of Santa Claus, with the
red coat and big white beard, came from Harper's
Weekly cartoonist Thomas Nast. In 1863, he drew
a cartoon of his Santa visiting Union Soldiers. This
is considered the first image of the modern Santa
Claus. Nast is also the first to say that Santa lived
at the North Pole. Nast's drawings later served
as an inspiration for Coca-Cola when creating
their iconic ads featuring Santa, popularizing his
modern image.

TAXATION OF THE SHARING ECONOMY

The sharing economy is peer-to-peer
based activity to acquire, provide, or share
access to goods and services. If you participate
as a provider, you can use personal asset to
generate income. It might be your house
(Airbnb), your car (Uber or Lyft), your skills
(Fiverr, Upwork), or your consumer goods
(eBay, Etsy).

The tax implications begin with deciding
whether the activity is a business (where you
intend to make a profit from the activity) or a
hobby (where you are doing it only to generate
some extra cash). If your profit motive is real
you must treat it like a business, starting with
keeping business like records to track your
income and expenses. Identifying income
is pretty obvious but what are you allowed
to deduct? IRS Publication 535 on Business
Expenses defines deductible expenses: To
be deductible, a business expense must be
both ordinary and necessary. An ordinary
expense is one that is common and accepted
in your industry. A necessary expense is one
that is helpful and appropriate for your trade
or business. An expense does not have to be
indispensable to be considered necessary.

If the activity is actually a hobby, the
income must still be claimed on your tax return.
The expenses of the activity are limited to the
amount of the income generated. You can't
deduct expenses greater than the income if it
is actually a hobby.

Whenever a personal asset is used in a
business there has to be a separation of the
personal portion of the expenses from the
business portion. For vehicle use (Uber, Lyft)
you must track the miles driven for business
but you can rely on the IRS approved cents-
per-mile rate to count your deductible expense.
There are specific rules for determining the
deductible expenses for renting a portion of
your home (Airbnb). Every home and every
situation will be different.

If you are selling your used personal
property on e-Bay or Craigslist the income
doesn't have to be claimed. If you are selling
collectible items or items that you have
specifically acquired (made or purchased) to
resell online you have a business that needs
to be tracked and reported.

CITY OF KENNESAW TO HOST

GRAND OPENING CELEBRATION FOR INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND

The City of Kennesaw and Kennesaw Parks & Recreation invite area residents to attend the Grand Opening Celebration for the Inclusive Playground at Swift-Cantrell Park, located at 3140 Old 41 Hwy NW, on Wednesday, December 18 at 11 a.m.

The current playground features nine (9) slides, 11 swings and a main play structure that has 100 feet of ADA ramps and sensory boards. The additions will include four (4) play structures to approximately 5,000 square feet that is currently unused. This will include a main play structure that has wheelchair accessible ramps that lead to a ropes tower, sensory stations, an eight (8) person wheelchair sway fun and a slide. The ramp system will also lead to pod climbers, a tunnel system and climbing apparatuses. The main play structure has 40 feet of shade.

The entire 18,500 square foot space has been made accessible to everyone by removing the wood chips and installing turf. Every child will be able to maneuver the entire space.



ALL ABOARD FOR HOLIDAY FUN AT THE SOUTHERN MUSEUM

On Saturday, December 14, the Southern Museum of Civil War and Locomotive History is hosting a holiday event featuring activities for kids young and old, all of which are free with regular Museum admission. The highlight of the event will be a screening of the Christmas classic *The Polar Express* (2004). The film will be shown twice throughout the day, once at 10:30am and again at 2:30pm. CHRISTMAS DINNER AT OUR HOUSE

Growing up, Christmas dinner at the Carter house was a big deal. There would be so much food on the dinner table, no one could sit there. You would have to fix your plate and move to the living room or den to eat. (After we said the blessing, of course.) We never broke out the “good china” for Christmas dinner. I’m pretty sure we never owned good china! Instead, we broke out the heavy Styrofoam or paper plates. The really big ones. Plastic cups with tea would be filled in advance, as to keep the line moving.



We always enjoyed a traditional southern Christmas dinner – turkey, ham, giblet gravy, mac and cheese, rolls, a green vegetable, maybe some potatoes, and lots of desserts. The stars of the show, however were my Mama’s cornbread dressing and her icebox fruitcake!

To this day, I’ve never found any dressing to top my Mama’s. She knew how to get a really rich stock from the turkey and that was the key! She would often bolster the turkey stock by also cooking the turkey neck and a couple of chicken thighs – nothing out of a can EVER! It was pretty basic from there – cornbread, sage, salt, pepper, celery, onion, butter, and that incredible stock.

The icebox fruitcake was something to be celebrated. I’m not even sure where Mama got the recipe. I can’t remember a time when it wasn’t part of the Christmas menu. It was made from finely crushed graham crackers, raisins, melted marshmallows, and pecans. Maybe some butter, I’m not sure. She would assemble all of the ingredients, mold it into a loaf, wrap it in aluminum foil, and then place it back into the graham cracker box. It would then go into the refrigerator until it hardened. I don’t consider myself a fruitcake fan, but this was fantastic! My wonderful sister-in-law Doris still makes it and brings it to family gatherings, and it’s still a smash hit!

CUPPING MASSAGE

Cupping is an ancient Chinese therapy used for many health benefits. Today we use cupping in various forms such as: Wet Cupping, Dry Cupping, Stationary Cupping and Moving Cupping to name a few. Using Cupping in combination with various massage techniques is a useful tool for the treatment of neck pain, shoulder pain, back pain, leg pain, etc.

Cupping is not a painful process. Cupping can be very relaxing and soothing. By using suction (or lifting tissue up) is bringing more circulation to the areas to be treated. Deep tissue or other massage techniques are pushing down on the skin to stimulate circulation. The cups can be placed on the skin for several minutes or move by gliding them over the areas to be treated. 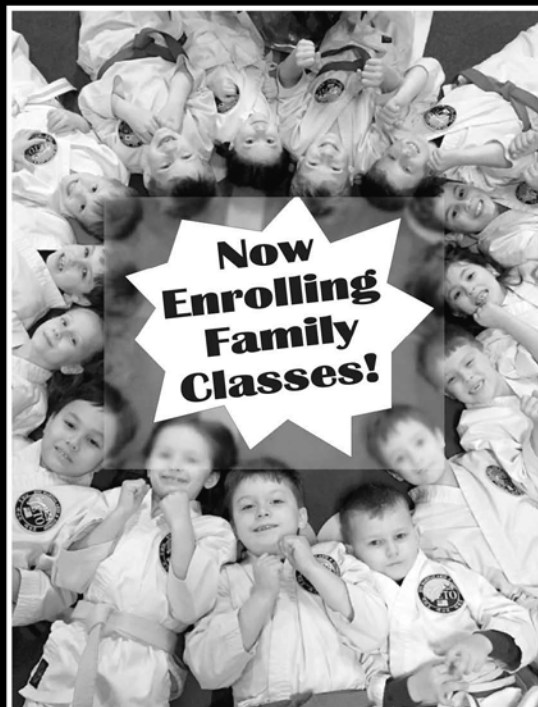

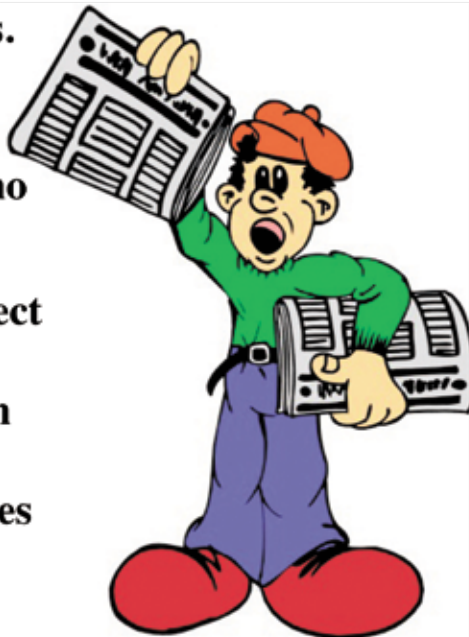

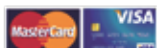

“YANKEE HOTEL, A STORY OF ANDERSONVILLE”

A BOOK SIGNING AT AVERY GALLERY, MARIETTA

Why was Andersonville chosen for the prison site. When General Bragg went to Richmond as Military Advisor of Jefferson Davis, he instituted a rigid systems of inspections there & when it was reported to him that the federal prisoners were not well feed because the food had to be transported from southern Georgia over several hundred miles of railroad and that they were as well as the soldiers of the Army of Northern Virginia. “Then” said he “Remove them to Georgia where the food is grown” S.H. Stout.

Dr. Samuel Hollingsworth Stout picked the spot of Andersonville Prison. Yankee Hotel is how the events unfold as Andersonville grew in prisoner population with newly found prisoner and guard letters which will help explain the events. Then take a journey through the Andersonville National Cemetery with soldier and prisoner letters. Some are the last letters these men would write.

Join Avery Gallery on December 13 or December 14 to hear stories of the Andersonville Prison as it was opened February of 1864 and closed April 1865, and during that short 14 months almost 13,000 prisoners died and nearly 300 guards died. Living historians will take you through the prisoners and guards story from letters and documents of the prisons history. See a rare hand painted photograph of a Union Prisoner from Andersonville, and other items of the Andersonville Prison. Brad Quinlin has been a volunteer at the Andersonville National Historic site for 28 years.

The hand painted photo of the soldier was restored and framed by Avery Gallery, and the Texas family owners will have it with them to show at the book signing. Come join with the authors, historians, conservators and interested folks.

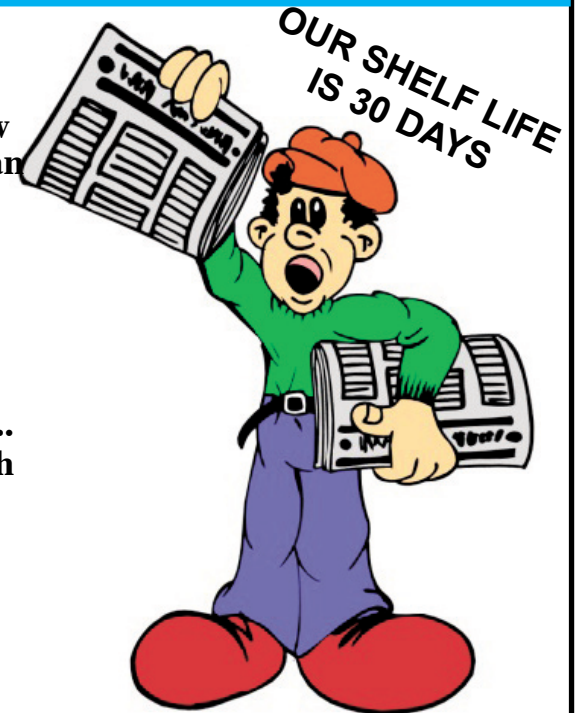

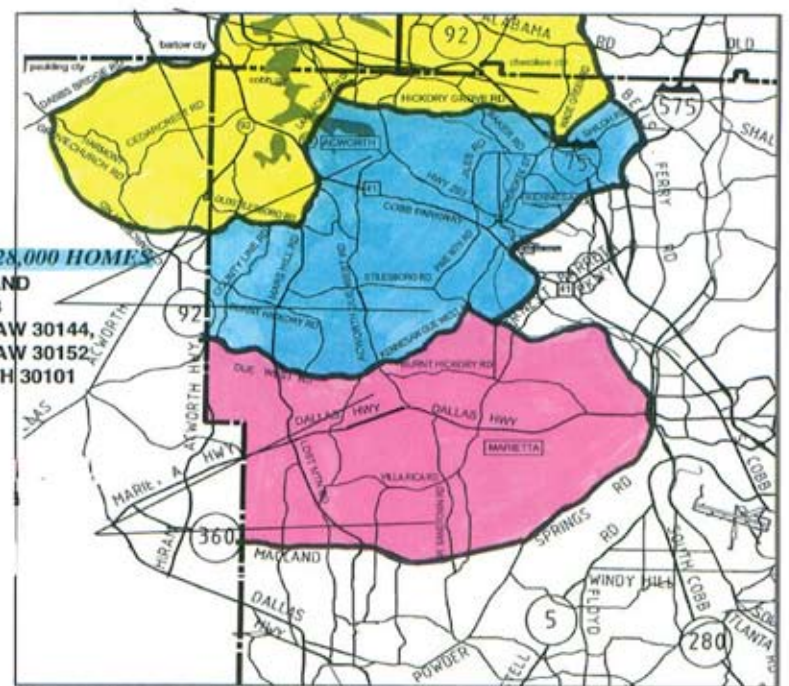
